### ✧ **Gathering as God's People: Our Theme *Psalms as Living Prayers***

Throughout the summer we've been exploring the practice of prayer through the lens of the Psalms. Father Richard describes prayer in his text, *Everything Belongs: The Gift of Contemplative Prayer*, in which he writes, "Prayer is not primarily saying words or thinking thoughts. It is, rather, a life stance. It's a way of living in the Presence, living in awareness of the Presence, and even of enjoying the Presence."

How might we each develop such a connection with the Divine, in which we live in the Presence, in awareness of the Presence, and even enjoying the Presence?

Although today is a "rerun" from August 21, 2022, in preparation for this week, I again turned to Father Rohr's Center for Action and Contemplation resource and came across another more recent insight of Richard Rohr's regarding prayer: "Going to the deepest level of communication, where back and forth has never stopped. Where I am not the initiator but the transmission wire itself."

We will hear Psalm 139 together this morning, and the psalmist will reveal this deep connection, this recognition of being the "transmission wire" in which there is no separation from the Divine: "O Lord, you have searched me and known me...it was you who formed my inward parts...my frame was not hidden from you

As we continue to explore the psalms, let us listen for the intimate prayers that we hear in them. Let us consider how these words align with our experiences and tap into the joy and pain that is expressed through them.

### **Psalm 139**

*The Inescapable God*

*To the leader. Of David. A Psalm.*

O LORD, you have searched me and known me.  
You know when I sit down and when I rise up;  
you discern my thoughts from far away.  
You search out my path and my lying down,  
and are acquainted with all my ways.  
Even before a word is on my tongue,  
O LORD, you know it completely.  
You hem me in, behind and before,

Where can I go from your spirit?  
Or where can I flee from your presence?
